Math Standards:

1-We need to be vigilant in supporting students who are at or near standards.

2-We are seeing the positive effect of the GCI in our 3rd Grade Cohort (nearly 100 percent are at, near or above standards).

3-We are seeing a slight dip in 4th grade. Further examination/attention to this area is needed.

ELA Standards:

1-Writing is an area of strength that we will continue to focus on with our Writing Workshop model of instruction.

2-Writing continues to be an area we apply across curricular areas.

3-Research, inquiry, and listening are solidly in the at or near standard range.
