PARENT'S RIGHT TO KNOW NOTIFICATION

A los padres/tutores:

Su hijo/a asiste a una escuela que recibe fondos del Título I según lo establece la Ley Federal para la Educación Primaria y Secundaria (Elementary and Secondary Education Act, ESEA). - da clases con un permiso de emergencia u otro tipo de permiso que está exento de los criterios de cualificación o licencia estatales; y
- da clases en el campo de estudio de certificación del maestro.

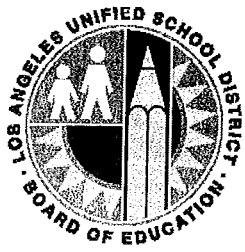
