Discussion: Minutes from October meeting were read and discussed.

Conclusion: Motion was made and accepted minutes from October meeting.

Speaker: Shealee Mitchell - presentation on School Based Health Center (SBHC)

Question - How would billing be conducted if a family did not have traditional insurance?

Answer – Lynn Pool - Billing would be the same as if you went to a clinic. WISD does not work with insurance or personal information. We assume that fees would be comparable with going to a clinic. That is something that we will be looking into further.

Question - Have you thought how this would affect local pediatricians? Who could this hurt?

Answer - That might occur but we need to look at how many students would get service as opposed to not. We are in the early stages and are looking into every aspect of the program.

Question - Would the nurses' offices on campuses have to be reconstructed or would we just add the "machines" in the offices?

Answer - At this time, we would just use what we have.

Question - What about the privacy issue of several kids being in the nurse's office at one time?

Answer - We are working on this and yes, the office will be organized so there is not more than one student in at the same time.

Question - What if a student has a scraped knee? Does the nurse still see kids for small things?

Answer - Sure, we would have 2 pathways in the office...one for the clinic and one for just the normal school nurse things.

Question - Would there still be nurses aides?

Answer - Absolutely.

Question - It was mentioned in the presentation that parents would sign up for this during registration. What if parents are not aware of this offering at that time? How do we educate our parents about this program?

Answer - The roll out plan is being considered. There will be multiple opportunities for parents to sign up. Not just during registration.

Question - What is in the dental health part of the program?

Answer - Dental is a referral program for parents. We have lots of references and can make appointments for students.

Question - The presentation showed a flow chart of the process with the parent being notified last (student, nurse, doctor, parent). What is the notification process if my child come to the clinic?

Answer - The flow chart only shows all the people involved and does not mean one added at a time. All will be present at the same time.

Speaker: Tom Kidd - presentation on new program for 5th grade and up concerning juvenile law

Question - When will this program start? We need it sooner than later.

Answer - We are working on it at this time with everyone that will be involved.

Question - Is there a problem with kids knowing how to act when a police officer approaches the?

Answer - Sometimes. Some of the older kids want to resist.

Question - How does the law work with a minor? What is the process with a minor?

Answer - A 10 year old can be arrested and 10 - 16 is considered a juvenile. The juvenile will be released to the parent but can be arrested and handcuffed and taken to jail in certain circumstances. The parents will get an attorney and go to court and the student will have a record that will be sealed and dismissed later unless there is a felony charge.

Question - What percent of kids do you see again? What percent get in trouble a second time?

Answer - 33% of juveniles we see more than once. If the student has a strong support system, they have a better chance to recover and be successful.

Suggestions for juvenile program –

1. Start program younger than 5th grade.
2. Have students that have been in trouble tell their story.
3. Present to small groups.
