

Cosmetology Program: High-School Dual-Credit

#### How the program works:

Ideally, students start the program Junior year. Students will participate in 2 classes per semester throughout the course of their Junior and Senior year, totaling 8 classes and 1,000 clock hours. If program is successfully completed in this manner, students will graduate high-school with a Certificate of Cosmetology through Lee College. This allows the students to obtain both their high-school diploma as well as a certificate to begin a career in the field of cosmetology.

This program can be started Senior year, but student will have to transfer acquired classes and hours over into the college level program after high-school graduation, and complete the program with 12 total classes and 1,500 clock hours.

## Benefits of the dual-credit program:

Taking advantage of the program at the high-school level allows the student to receive the same education as college level students but at a much reduced cost. Not only is the cost lower, but the required college credit hour classes and clock hours are less.

This program is a great opportunity for those students who are looking to start their careers immediately after high-school graduation. This program also offers a career path for those students who are looking to continue their education at the college level.

This program can also open doors to many other opportunities within the cosmetology field. With this education, a student could work as a cosmetologist, educate with well-known product companies, become stage artists, the possibilities are endless. All it takes is hard work and determination.

## Lee College Cosmetology Program

## **High- School Dual-Credit**

#### **Beginning of Program:**

Parents and students should expect to pay minimal costs and fees. Below are listed items that students will need and use throughout the program.

Cost of classes: \$100\* per class (2 classes per semester/8 total)

Cost of supply kit: \$150\* per semester

Cost of textbook/workbook: \$200\* (one-time fee, used through completion of program)

State Mandated Student Permit Fee: \$25\* (one-time fee)

Sleeved Smock: \$25\*

Program T-shirt: \$15\* (required for field trips)

## **End of Program:**

Students will use their last semester to prepare for the State Licensing Exam. Students will be required to take a written examination followed with a practical examination through PSI Exams. During the State Preparation class, students will be required to buy and pack all of the supplies needed for the practical portion of the exam. Passing both of the exams will result in eligibility for the TDLR Cosmetology Operator's License.

Cost of exam supplies: \$100\*

Written Examination: \$52\*

Practical Examination: \$74\*

TDLR Cosmetology Operator License: \$50\* (due to expire every 2 years)

# Certificate of Completion in Cosmetology-CO1

This certificate program will provide for 1500 hours of instruction scheduled on the basis of 32 hours per week, to be completed within 12 months. This program will provide students with an opportunity to learn the basic manipulative and theoretical skills necessary to become a licensed cosmetologist.

To earn a certificate, students must successfully complete courses contained in a block unit taught in three semesters.

# Cosmetology

#### Your Opportunity

Cosmetology continues to be a growing industry and the Bureau of Labor Statistics projects that employment in the industry will grow at a rate of between 9-17% by the year 2014, due to increasing population, rising incomes, and growing demand for personal appearance services. The cosmetology industry is a great career choice, with many employment opportunities to choose from. It is one of the few career choices where you can be your own boss, express your creativity, and enjoy what you are doing all by making people look and feel great.

However, where you get your training is as important as passing the board exam, so please take your time and shop smart when looking for a cosmetology school. Our tuition rates are below most private cosmetology schools and competitive with other community colleges. As with all community colleges, if you qualify for financial aid, excess grant money not used to pay tuition and supplies is refunded to help with personal expenses while attending college.

#### Career Opportunities

After licensing by the state of Texas, career possibilities are endless. You can find employment opportunities as a hair stylist, nail technician, facial/skin care specialist, or even own or manage a salon. There are also jobs as a product sales representative or a product educator for many major supply companies.

#### Supplies and Equipment

Students are required to furnish all textbooks as well as supplies. Complete course information can be obtained from the instructor in the Cosmetology Department.

#### **Program Requirements**

Students must be 16 years old or older, and have a high school diploma or GED. However, students may take the GED class concurrently with the cosmetology classes as long as they receive the GED before enrolling in CSME 2245.

- A supply kit for the Cosmetology Operator Program is required and is available in the Lee College Bookstore for approximately \$500.00.
- Textbooks may be purchased at the Lee College Bookstore, approximate cost for books is \$300.00.

# Additional Program Information and Requirements

- For convenience, Lee College Cosmetology offers two campuses, Main Campus located at Lee Drive and Gulf Street in Baytown, and McNair Career Center located at 3411 I-10.
- Each campus requires a uniform. Please check with an instructor from the campus of your choice about their uniform requirements before making any purchases.
- A \$25.00 registration fee payable to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation is required for all new, first time cosmetology students. This fee will register you with the state

and is required to begin clocking hours. While you may pay with a money order or cashier's check, for convenience, TDLR accepts cedit/debt card payments to immediately register you at the time of payment.

#### **Employment Outlook**

According to Career Cruising 1999-2008, a cosmetologist working in a salon may be paid in a number of ways: by the hour, straight salary, salary plus commission, or straight commission. Most salons sell lines of beauty products; in some cases, cosmetologists get a small commission when their clients buy the products.

A full-time hair stylist can expect to earn between \$17,000 and \$40,000 a year. Salaries for manicurists, pedicurists, and skin care specialists range from about \$15,000 to \$35,000 a year, although some experienced specialists in high-end salons can earn as much as \$50,000 a year.

Some cosmetologists work independently, either by renting space and equipment in a large salon or by setting up their own salons. Earnings for these cosmetologists vary depending on location and clientele. Those who are just starting out may earn as little as \$5,000 a year, and successful cosmetologists can earn more than \$50,000 a year.
