

DO YOU HAVE:

1. California Driver's License → Yes - Go to Notary →

or

2. US Passport

*Must be current, not expired

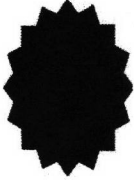


No, then DO YOU HAVE:

1. Valid passport or Consular ID issued by Country of citizenship - if not US
2. ID card from another State
3. Military ID
4. California State, County or City Employee ID
5. Tribal government ID

* Any of the above must be issued within last 5 years, must have your photo and include a description of you, your signature and an identifying number

→ Yes - Go to Notary →



No, then BRING TWO WITNESSES

They must:

1. Know you personally, but can't be a relative and can't be involved in the Family Preparedness Plan
2. Have appropriate ID listed above



The name on the ID must match the name on the document to be notarized. The Notary cannot charge more than \$15 per signature notarized. A person who claims to be an immigration consultant or a specialist in immigration matters is prohibited from advertising that he or she is also a Notary.
