

## Dual Enrollment & Early College Talking Points

<u>Dual Enrollment Program</u>	<u>Early College Program</u>
VT juniors & seniors are eligible for vouchers to take 2 college courses.	VT seniors can complete final year of high school at college, tuition free.
Students earn college credit and credit at their high school.	Students must apply to college. Once accepted into the college the student: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• must be unenrolled from the high school;</li> <li>• shall be enrolled as a full-time student at the college;</li> <li>• is responsible for applicable fees and textbook costs.</li> </ul>
Students may take courses during summers preceding their junior & senior year.	Students graduate with diploma from home high school. <i>* Note: VAST works differently.</i>
PLP must be in place by November 30, 2015 listing the Dual Enrollment Program element.	PLP must be in place by November 30, 2015 listing the Early College Program element.

High school designee approves vouchers for students at the high school.  The Agency of Education approves vouchers for home study students.	Principal has to approve the student is ready for the EC Program.  Home study parent has to approve the student is ready for the EC Program.
Student stays enrolled at the high school/home study program.	Student must un-enroll from the high school/home study program and shall be enrolled as a full-time student at the college.
IEP services are delivered at the home high school. <i>Students need to understand that not all accommodations available at the high school will be allowed in college classes.</i>	Students on IEP are no longer eligible to receive services from the high school. Students will need to get disability services from the college.

\* VAST is an independent high school so can issue diplomas. VAST students have the option to get a diploma from their sending school. In which case, they would need to re-enroll in their sending school prior to receiving their diploma.

# Dual Enrollment & Early College Rate Information

## Dual Enrollment

Dual Enrollment amounts and various pricing levels include:

At the time of the dual enrollment course offering:	
Type of Course	FY 16
When the course is delivered on a college campus and the college pays the instructor, all colleges (except CCV) are reimbursed the CCV rate for dual enrollment courses.	Cost per credit (\$246) up to a 4-credit course. Most courses are 3 credits (\$738)
When the course is delivered on a college campus and CCV pays the instructor, CCV is reimbursed at 90% of their rate for CCV courses.	Cost per credit (\$221.40). Most courses are 3 credits (\$664.20)
When a course is taught by a high school instructor and paid by the high school, participating colleges are reimbursed 20% of the CCV rate for dual enrollment.	\$147.60 (based on a 3-credit course)

\* These guidelines provide the current FY 16 rates. Please note, the VSC Board determines the CCV tuition rate annually and rates may be different for FY 17.

## Early College

The base education amount is established in the annual state budget. For FY16 it is \$9285, and 87% of that is \$8078. This amount is intended to cover tuition for both semesters, not each. All participating colleges will be reimbursed at that rate with the exception of CCV. The CCV per credit tuition rate, depending on the number of credits, can calculate to less than \$8078.
