SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE - DR. REESE

This is a great time of year to celebrate with our families, but it is also an appropriate time to reflect on the past year and to set goals for the upcoming year. My past six months in the district have allowed me to learn a lot about this district.

I believe one of the biggest strengths of Westport is the community, from the students and parents to the school staff to other members of the community that provide supports to our students. We have a dedicated staff, committed to each child. We have hard-working students, who are invested in their learning and giving back to the community. We are also very fortunate to work in a community where so many people value and support the work that we do each day with the children of Westport. This support was reflected in the vote earlier this spring in support of the new school building. This was no simple task and we truly appreciate the commitment of a number of Westport's residents in support of this effort. While the opening of the building is almost three years away, we continue to work closely with members of the school building committee, various town boards, and a number of community members to complete this project and provide a beautiful building that not only meets the changing needs of students today, but also is an incredible resource for the community. I recognize that any proposed building project can have some challenges, however, I firmly believe that the new building will be an incredible asset for our community for years to come and appreciate the willingness of a variety of community groups in working with us to ensure that the opening of the Westport Middle-High School is something can celebrate!

My goals for for the upcoming year are to:

- continue to improve communication/outreach efforts
- work closely with each school to ensure that our proposed budget for the 2019-2020 school year reflects current student population/needs & provides for rigorous instruction and courses for all students
- increase school safety and training for students and staff

SCHOOL SAFETY

Beginning in January, students and staff will have an opportunity to practice various safety strategies that might be employed should there be an intruder in the building. In January, all students and staff will participate in a table-top exercise. On a non-specified day, there will be an announcement made over the intercom notifying students and staff of the drill and asking them to complete the tabletop exercise with their class. This drill should take no longer than 15-20 minutes. All of the feedback provided by students and staff will be reviewed by the central office administration, school administrators and our SRO officer. Issues will be identified and will be reviewed with staff at a meeting in the afternoon. On the following day, staff will do a debrief with students to discuss anything else to consider for future drills. Please note that for this drill in January, students and staff will not be implementing any of the strategies... they will only be discussing the various strategies and problem-solving about the different options.



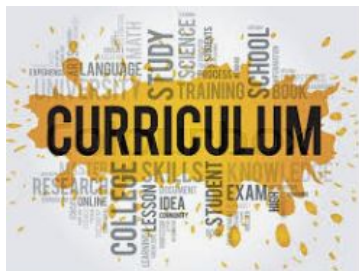
We will communicate with families on the day that the drill is occurring to let you know that it is happening, as well as any outcomes from the drill.

While we recognize that holding these types of 'drills' may seem a bit scary, particularly for younger students, it is imperative that we practice and help both our staff and students develop the strategies to protect themselves in the unlikely event that there is an intruder in a building. WESTPORT MIDDLE-HIGH SCHOOL SCHOOL BUILDING PROJECT UPDATES

We are very excited by the continued progress of this building project that will house all of our fifth-twelfth grade students beginning in September 2021.. At the November school committee meeting, the school committee decided that the building will be named the Westport Middle-High School.

Each month, we will provide the community with an update of the ongoing work. Over the next two weeks, the abatement/demolition contractor will be completing the abatement activities on the second floor level and begin preparation for demolition. Abatement will continue on the first floor level with containment breakdown occurring by end of December 21st and followed by preparations for demolition. Roof work will continue with the removal of the roofing system and insulation.

Drilling of the water supply well has commenced and will continue to the depth of 500' or until water is reached.



TECHNOLOGY - MR. NEKRASZ

The IT Department is in the process of implementing the rest of the technology bought during the summer months. We purchased 150 Chromebooks and 70 HP desktop computers. The Chromebooks were distributed this past autumn and the PC will start to be installed over the Holiday break.



These PC's are robust computers running Microsoft Windows 10 Professional. They have 16 gigabyte of RAM, 256 Gig SSD drives and digital video connectors to easily connect to a monitor and projector. These PC's in the Westport Elementary School and the Macomber School will enhance the classrooms for teachers and students.

The Chromebooks are the latest model for student use with touchscreens. They are capable to run the latest version of TestNav, which is the program that students will use to complete the new online MCAS testing.

TRANSPORTATION - MS. RAPOZA

As the winter weather comes upon us, please be sure to dress your children appropriately. Ice and snow can be challenging for bus drivers, remind your children to stay clear until the bus makes a complete stop when loading and unloading.



There has been a great concern with vehicles passing school buses while their stop lights are on. If you see a vehicle pass a school bus, take down the license plate and vehicle description and report to your local police department. Failing to stop or illegally passing a stopped school bus with flashing lights can result in a \$250 fine in Massachusetts, at minimum. A second offense by a fine of not less than \$500. That fine can go up to \$2,000 and a suspended license of up to a year for subsequent offenses (MGL 90-14).

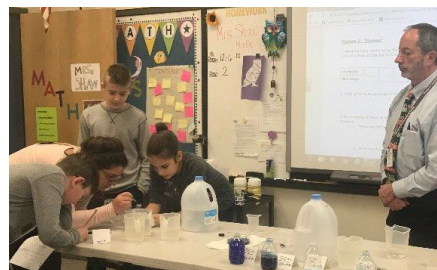
Students are not allowed to be dropped off in the front of the schools, please drop off children in the designated drop off areas.

In order to reduce some of the waste in the cafeteria, The Macomber School implemented a "share table" at the Macomber School. We are beginning the Share Table with grade 2, students may put unopened milk and other sealed items on the designated table. Other students may take the items. Mrs. Mahjoory has been discussing this with the grade 2 students to educate them on food waste. Thank you to everyone for their efforts as we kick this challenge off throughout the other grade levels. The School Lunch Program began taste testing new school lunch entrees. We completed the first taste testing at the Macomber School on December 11 with students trying Chicken Alfredo with Pasta. The 1st and 2nd grade students enjoyed it the most. We will be taste testing at the Westport Elementary School in January and then the Jr. Sr. High School in February.
