ABOUT US

President Theodore Roosevelt High School is a public, co-educational college preparatory high school of the Hawai'i State Department of Education and serves grades nine through twelve. Roosevelt High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and is one of the oldest public secondary schools in the state of Hawaii.

The school is most famous for its buildings and landmark domed bell tower constructed in Spanish mission architectural style in 1930. Its buildings were and are used as backdrops in several movie and television productions. Adjacent to the historic bell-towered building is the 2001 Hawaiian basalt sculpture 'Ho'okahi' (To Make as One), by Mark Watson.

Roosevelt High School is located in urban Honolulu, Hawai'i. It is situated in Makiki's Kalāwahine Valley adjacent to the National Memorial Cemetary of the Pacific, overlooking downtown Honolulu and Ala Moana. Neighborhoods include Nu'uaniu, Pacific Heights, Pauoa, Papakolea, Round Top, Makiki, Tantalus, and Manoa.

ROOSEVELT COMMUNITY

Honolulu is a cosmopolitan city of over 800,000. The densely populated Roosevelt area is located mauka (mountain-side) of the H-1 freeway.

The median age is approximately 43 years of age, reflecting a low percentage of the demographics being under the age of 19 and the high proportion of people 65 years and over.

More than half of the residents in the Roosevelt area are Asian, with the percentages of Japanese, Chinese, and Koreans higher here than in some other areas of the State. Approximately 14% of the residents are Hawaiian or part-Hawaiian.

Only 50% of the people in this area own their own homes, and the percentage of young children living in poverty is higher than in 60% of the other communities Statewide.

This is due to recent immigrants who have located in this community: Indo-Chinese, Micronesians, Chuukese, to name a few.

The majority of the residents have a high school diploma. More than 2/3 have Bachelor's degree or better. Parents report a high level of involvement in their children's schools and children in the Roosevelt area do well on their 3rd grade SAT tests.
