Spotlight on Carlisle Elementary Building a Caring Community of Respectful Learners... One Meeting at a Time

Walk into any classroom at Carlisle Elementary at 8:10 a.m. and you'll find students and staff sitting in a circle engaged in a Morning Meeting. Morning Meetings last up to a half hour each day and are composed of four sequential components: greeting, sharing, group activity, and morning message. The components intentionally provide opportunities for students to practice the skills of greeting, listening and responding, group problem-solving, and noticing and anticipation.



Daily practice of the four components gradually creates a classroom community. In a Morning Meeting, all classroom members – grown-ups and students – gather in a circle, greet each other, and listen and respond to each other's news. We take note of who is present and who is absent; we practice academic skills; briefly grapple with problems that challenge our minds, and look forward to the learning we'll do together in the day ahead.



Each component of the Morning meeting has various, specific purposes:

Greeting

- Sets a positive tone for the classroom for the day
- Provides a sense of recognition and belonging
- Helps students learn and use each other's names
- Gives practice in hospitality

Sharing

- Helps students to know each other
- Develops important social and emotional competencies
- Teaches thinking, listening, and speaking skills
- Strengthens language development and reading success
- Strengthens academic and social skills



Activity

- Contributes to the class's sense of community and group identity by building a repertoire of common songs, games, chants, and poems
- Fosters active and engaged participation
- Encourages inclusion and cooperation
- Can help students learn the value of persistence and practice
- Strengthens academic and social skills

Morning Message

- Builds community through shared written information
- Develops and reinforces language arts, math, and other academic skills in meaningful and interactive ways
- Eases the transition into the rest of the day and builds students' excitement about the day's learning

Morning Meetings are a microcosm of the way we wish our schools to be – communities full of learning, safe and respectful, and challenging for all. It has quickly become the favorite part of the day for both students and staff. Ask your student for additional information or feel free to become part of your child's Morning Meeting if you're able to visit. You might see support staff and building administrators engaged in Morning Meetings as well as we build a caring community of respective learners...one meeting at a time.
