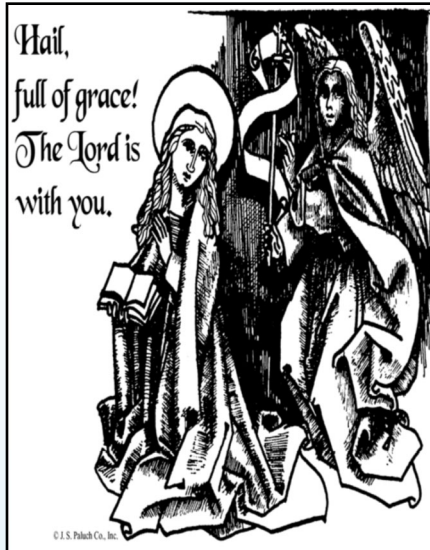

## GOD'S PROMISE

The lengthy passage from Samuel is a wonderful exposition of God's promise to the house of David: that his throne would forever be gloriously occupied by his descendants.



Hidden in the mystery of the prophecy is the promise of the Savior, the Messiah, Son of God and Son of David. The prophet Nathan, speaking in God's name, poetically turns around David's plan to build a house for God, and announces God's plan to build a "house," that is, a dynasty for David. From this house of David will come the Messiah, the Christ, not in kingly splendor as David ruled, but as a humble man, destined to rule forever and over all. When God gives a gift, it's amazing what we are given—so different from what we ever could have imagined.

## The kingdom of hope



Today is the last Sunday of Advent, that time of preparation for the arrival of the Messiah, the anointed one, the heir to the kingdom of David. Today's first reading promises that David's kingdom will last forever, and that God will always protect it. As we know, such was not the case.

David's kingdom lasted only to the time of his grandsons, and was totally crushed by the time of the Babylonian exile five hundred years later. Does this mean that God lied? Or is it that Nathan misunderstood Him? If you notice, this is another one of those readings that has parts missing. Some of the answer is in those parts.

Notice that the beginning of this sequence is when David is upset over the fact that he lives in a fine house of cedar while "the ark of God dwells in a tent!" God's response to this, given to the prophet Nathan, is that He has been with the people in pastures, and that He has dwelt in a tent since the people were wandering in the desert. He doesn't need a house of cedar. His home is in the people, not the tent.

But what about His promise that David's house and kingdom shall endure forever? Once again, the missing passage adds something of importance. In verse 13, God says that it is *David's heir* "who shall build a house for My name." The Jews thought God meant Solomon, David's son who built the temple for the ark. Looking back with our knowledge, we can see that God meant Jesus, who built the house for God's name in the hearts of the people. That house has endured to the present.

The same is true for David's kingdom. Sometimes we don't fully understand the terminology of the Bible because we live in such different times. We live in a democracy where we can choose our way of life and are free to pursue our dreams. This is quite different from a kingdom, ruled by an all powerful monarch who could control the lives of his people. To those people, David had been chosen by God, and his word was the word of God. He must be obeyed.

At the same time, kingdom meant all the land that the king controlled, the people that he conquered. That is how we think as humans. The power of a king is directly proportional to the land he controls. When David and the Jewish people thought of the kingdom which God had promised would endure forever, they thought of that plot of land to the east of the Mediterranean Sea. When you think about it, it was a very limited kingdom.

We live in a time that is quite different from all other times in history. We can look at pictures from space and realize how large God's universe is. When He spoke of kingdoms, He didn't limit it to a small plot of land in the Middle East. The kingdom that God gave to David went far beyond that land and that time. It was *God's* kingdom here on earth, not that of a man, but of God.

What is God's kingdom? It is the kingdom of David's heir, Jesus of Nazareth. It is the Kingdom of Hope enduring forever.

It is us. Treat it well.
