

## Program Agreements

1. **HW Policy-** HW tutoring is available for one hour daily. We do not guarantee that all HW will be completed or corrected. You and your child are encouraged to review HW at home.
2. **Sign out Policy-** Safety is our top priority; therefore no student will be released from the Y.E.S Program without a parent/guardian signature or individuals 16 years or older.
3. **Student pick-up-** Children participating in YES must be signed out by you or someone you have designated on the child's registration form or be marked as walkers.
4. **Late Pick Up Policy-** If the student is picked up late (3) times, the student will be dropped from the program. If a designated person for pickup is more than 15 minutes late picking up a student, law enforcement may be contacted.
5. **Discipline-** Participation in the Y.E.S program is a privilege. Students who receive (3) referrals will be dropped from the program.
6. **Policy on liability-** Parents are informed that YES is not liable for any personal items that may be damaged or lost or for the cost of replacing such items. Y.E.S is not liable for the payment of expenses incurred as a result of any injuries.

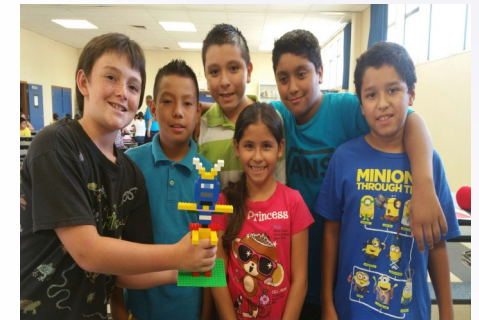

## Youth Experiencing Success (Y.E.S) Program

The (Y.E.S) Youth Experiencing Success team works diligently to provide engaging project based activities which encourages students to strive for success, both in and out of school.

Y.E.S provides a safe, constructive environment during non-school hours. The program is available for three hours immediately after school and consists of three daily sessions: academic, enrichment, and recreation. Y.E.S provides an opportunity to merge strategies and resources from the regular school day with community resources. Y.E.S strives to support the goals and efforts of each school by tutoring students and broadening the base of academic support.

## Our Goals

- Provide a healthy and safe environment for students and staff
- Provide students with high quality and engaging opportunities to learn and make measurable academic progress, particularly in the areas of reading/writing, math, and science
- Support the needs of working families
- Support healthy behavior and physical well-being
- Encourage the exploration of interests and the development of skills and creativity
- Promote respect and appreciation for diversity

## Attendance

Students are expected to regularly attend the program in its entirety. An Early Release Policy is in place for the purpose of allowing families to keep commitments for health, safety, and educational purposes.

Y.E.S encourages students to attend regularly in order to gain the most benefit from the program. Due to high demand, students with (10) unexcused absences may be automatically dropped from the program.

Note: Assembly Bill 1567 states that priority enrollment goes to Foster Youth, and the homeless. Attendance rules still apply.

## Early Release Policy

After attending the full academic component, a student may be released before 5:30 pm due to the conditions listed below:

- Attending a parallel program (e.g., soccer, basketball, etc.) that has been approved by the Site Supervisor.
- Family emergencies
- Transportation needs
- Medical/dental appointments
- Illness or injury
- Child custody/Court ordered
- Kinder release is 4:30 pm
- **Please note: Students are only excused twice a week for early release**
