Dress Code

Students' dress reflects the quality of the school and affects students' conduct. Students shall be dressed and groomed in a manner that is clean, neat and that will not be a health or safety hazard to themselves or others.

Any article of clothing, jewelry, body decoration or hairstyle extreme enough to create a distraction or disturb the normal routine of school shall be deemed inappropriate.

The district prohibits any clothing or grooming that in the campus administrator's judgment may reasonably be expected to cause disruption of or interfere with normal school operations. If hygiene becomes a problem, the parent will be contacted. It is the responsibility of all school personnel to enforce the dress code.

Shirts and Blouses

- Collared polo or oxford style shirt. Short or long sleeve. No sheer material.
- Must be any solid color: (No stripes, plaids, etc.)
- Shirts and blouses must be tucked in at all times except for PK-2nd grade students, who are encouraged to, but not required to do so.
- Logo is permissible if it is on the product at purchase and not a requested addition. Logo must be no larger than a half-dollar.
- No exposed midriffs or cleavage
- Undershirts must be any solid color.

Sweatshirts, Vests, Sweaters and Hoodies (pullover without zippers or buttons)

- Must be appropriately sized in the shoulders, sleeves and length and must be worn over an approved shirt or blouse and collar must be visible
- Must be any solid color
- Logo is permissible if it is on the product at purchase and not a requested addition. Logo must be no larger than a half-dollar.
- Approved JISD or college logo are also permissible.

Outerwear (with zippers or buttons)

- Coats and jackets must fit and not be excessively long as judged by the principal.

Pants, Shorts and Capris

- Pleated or flat front, cuffed or hemmed, with no logo larger than 2" X 2"
- Worn at the waistline
- Must be solid: Navy, Khaki, Gray or Black
- No denim
- Recommended 5 pockets or less for PK - 6th
- 6 pockets or less for 7th - 12th
- No exercise pants, wind pants, overalls or sweatpants
- Pants may not be cut, ripped or have holes of any kind (belt loops, pants legs, etc).
- Shorts must be no shorter than 2" above the knee

Skorts, Skirts, Jumpers and Polo Dresses

- Cuffed or hemmed and worn at waistline
- No Denim and no logo larger than 2" X 2"
- Must be solid: Navy , Khaki or Black
- Skirts, skorts, shorts and jumpers must touch the top of the knee or in elementary (PK-4) must be no shorter than outstretched fingertips.
- Polo dresses must follow shirt guidelines including color.

- No pictures or decorations of any kind
- Polo dresses must follow shirt guidelines including color.

Footwear

- No house shoes
- Shoes must be a matching pair and must be worn appropriately and as designed.
- No wheels in shoes

Recommended but Not Required

- Athletic shoes, loafers, dress shoes or other closed-toed shoes
- Heels no greater than 1 1/2 inches in height

Belts

- Belts must be leather-like, dress-style or canvas and worn if there are belt loops, . Buckles must be buckled.
- Belts must be worn within belt-loops and must be visible and have no excessive length.
- Belts are optional for PK-2nd grade students.

Other Guidelines

- All clothing and shoes must be worn as they were intended to be worn.
- No hats, boys' headbands, bandanas, toboggans, beanies, skull caps, sunglasses or any other head coverings.
- No excessively loose clothing, including coats and jackets
- No excessively tight clothing.
- No long coats reaching below mid-thigh
- No sleeveless clothing
- College logo may only be worn on designated university days
- No symbols, words or slogans, lines, designs, numbers, etc. are to be cut in the hair or eyebrow.
- No exposed tattoos or jewelry that are distracting, racially related, gang related, offensive or provocative
- No distracting make-up, hair color or hair styles; this includes mohawks and faux-hawks.
- Hair color must be a natural shade.
- Well groomed facial hair is permissible.
- No ponytails on boys

Other Guidelines Continued

- Boys' hair length in back must be worn so that it is no longer than the top of the collar.
- Boys' hair in front must be worn so that it is no longer than the top of the eyebrow with the sides no longer than the bottom of the earlobe.
- No exposed body piercings except for earrings
- No earrings on boys.
- No grills or other objects covering the teeth
- Students in D.I.R.E.C.T. must wear approved pants and approved white shirts every day unless privileges are earned on upper levels.

All Fridays and Designated Spirit Days

Blue Jeans (no colored denim allowed except black , gray or khaki) may be worn with an approved spirit day logo shirt or an approved shirt (see Shirts and Blouses criteria) . (Spirit Days are designated by the campus administrator.)

Final Authority

Students must comply with district standards for grooming and accessories as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct. Final decisions on the appropriateness of school dress rest with the campus administration.

Consequences

If the campus administration determines that a student's grooming violates the dress code, the student shall be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If the violation cannot be fixed, the student's parent's or guardian will be notified and the student will not return to class until the violation is corrected. The student may also be sent home. All absences for dress code violation will be unexcused.

New Student in JISD

Students new to the district have seven (7) calendar days from the date of enrollment to comply with the policy.
