- Protect your passwords and login information.

- Tell an adult if someone makes you feel uncomfortable, sad, or confused online.

- Do not post information like your cell phone, address, or

inappropriate videos and pictures online. These things could damage your future.

- Remember, once it's online, it's there forever! (Even if you delete it)
- Talk to your parents about the "house" rules for internet usage and device time.
- Be respectful of yourself and others online.
- Abide by the copyright laws within the *Fair Use Doctrine of the United States Copyright Law (Title 17, USC)*
- Do not tolerate bullying online. Be a supporter and advocate for respect for others.
- Talk with a parent before talking with someone online that you do not know.
