PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

The Cheboygan Area Schools district is organized by grade level. Students in grades K-2 are assigned to East Elementary. Students in grades 3-7 are assigned to Cheboygan Intermediate School and students in grades 8-12 are assigned to Cheboygan Area High School or Inverness Academy. To enroll in the district, parents fill out an enrollment form available in each of the schools listed above or on the District web site. Parents who live outside of the district must also fill out a Schools of Choice form available at each school.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Based on disaggregated data from the MEAP, DIBELS, QRI, Running Records, local portfolios, and NWEA, goals for Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies were established and discussions at school improvement meetings and leadership team meetings were held. Below are the Broad goals for East Elementary School:

All students will be proficient in Reading.
All students will be proficient in Writing.



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All students will be proficient in Mathematics.
All students will be proficient in Science.
All students will be proficient in Social Studies.

All other data is collected and kept in individual portfolios and discussed with parents and teachers two to three times per year. Copies of this data can be reviewed at the East Elementary School office

HOW TO ACCESS A COPY OF THE CORE CURRICULUM

A copy of the curriculum guide for each grade level is available on East Elementary School’s web page, the Board of Education Office or at the East Elementary School Office. There are no variances between the Michigan Curriculum Framework and the Cheboygan Area Schools board adopted curriculum. As changes are needed or required by the Michigan Department of Education or our local school board of education, grade level teams meet to address curricular needs with the principal and the Administrator for Curriculum and Instructional Strategies. Curriculum is revised and written, teachers are trained and may even pilot the material, curriculum and assessments prior to final approval from the board of education. A total of 283 students were represented by parents at parent teacher conferences. This represents 90% of student enrollment.

We are proud of the accomplishments that we have made this year. The addition of a new mathematics core program has helped align our curriculum standards and bring some consistency to our mathematics instruction. We look to do the same in our language arts curriculum as we update our core reading program next year. East Elementary will also continue to provide a rigorous curriculum and assess student progress with local portfolio assessments and the NWEA assessment program. We are confident that by monitoring student progress through these assessments and providing intervention strategies as needed our students will be prepared for the challenges that await them.
