

215-AR-2. TUTORING FOR REMEDIATION

Grades 7 – 12

Failed courses at the United School District may be remediated utilizing a teacher who is certified in the age level and content area of failed course under the guidelines of Board Policy 116, Tutoring. In order to avoid ethical concerns, the teacher who originally taught the course that was failed may not conduct the remediation tutoring. Course work can only start after the course has been officially failed.

When this option for remediation is utilized, the parent/guardians will contract privately with the certified teacher and the District will assume no responsibility or liability for the instruction.

Once the certified teacher is hired by the parent/guardian, s/he will meet with the building principal and teacher of the course(s) that was (were) failed to discuss the remediation needs to ensure that the student has mastered the content of the course.

Required minimum teacher contact hours are as follows:

- 1 credit course or equivalent = 30 hours
- ½ credit course or equivalent = 15 hours
- 1/4 credit course or equivalent = 8 hours

The student may be required to complete a variety of homework assignments, research projects and/or readings independent of the teacher “contact time.”

For secondary courses, the student must have successfully completed the required work, **and** pass the regular United School District course final exam in order to receive the credit.

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
