Our School and Community:

Westmont is a four-year public comprehensive high school located in Santa Clara's Silicon Valley, approximately 50 miles south of San Francisco. Located in a residential area on the western boundary of San Jose and Campbell, the school draws from families ranging from lower to upper-middle income. Employment is primarily in professional, high tech and service industries in Silicon Valley. The ethnic composition includes approximately 38% minority students. 21% of students are on free or reduced lunch. There are approximately 1650 students in grades 9 – 12.

Curriculum: Westmont High School offers a wide breadth of curriculum choices in a standards based academic environment. We take the responsibility of addressing the needs and desires of our community and for providing a strong and varied college preparatory curriculum, which solidly prepares our students for successful college entrance and completion. Westmont provides comprehensive exploratory courses in the vocational arts with further study available through the Santa Clara County Regional Vocational Center, co-operative efforts with our local Community Colleges, California State University and University of California.

Grades for Advanced Placement (AP) courses are computed on a five-point scale and are designated on the transcript with a plus symbol (+). All courses designated with (P) on the transcript meet the UC/CSU A-G admission requirements.
Students are ranked based on Weighted GPA.

Graduation Requirements

Westmont graduates are required to earn a minimum of 220 credits, five for each semester class passed with a "D-" or better. These include:

Westmont has a Block schedule with 8 periods consisting of 95 minutes with five minutes passing time. All students must carry at least 5 subjects. Students can take no more than 7 classes. Students are required to attend study hall period, which is held five days a week for 30 minutes each school day.

The school year is divided into two semesters of 18 weeks each. School is in session for 180 days.
