

Blackman High School Code of Integrity

Your Learning Belongs to You. The Blackman High School community (administrators, teachers, and students) expects integrity. Integrity is honesty in words, actions, and behaviors, and we expect each student and faculty member to conduct himself or herself with honor at all times. To reach the goal of maximum learning for every student, each student must complete his or her own work. This means that:

1. Students will not give **or** receive aid on tests, quizzes, or exams, whether in person or by electronic means;
2. Students will neither copy **nor** allow to be copied any homework or other assignments without teacher permission to collaborate;
3. Students will not plagiarize from any source;
4. Students will only make honest statements of fact on all documents, such as applications, service hour statements, resumes, personal essays, and other personal representations of high school achievements.

Procedures

First offense:

1. Zero for the assignment.
2. Parent notified by teacher; teacher fills out an Honor Code Notice.
3. Administrator will keep the Honor Code Notice for one year.
4. On the first offense, a student may choose to rework and resubmit the assignment for a maximum of 80% credit for grade purposes only.

Second offense:

1. Zero for the assignment.
2. Honor Code Notice to administrator.
3. Administrator notifies parents and, if applicable, the Collegiate Academy Dean. Administrator assigns in-school suspension to student, which affects final examination exemptions and other opportunities. Files will be available to extracurricular sponsors and coaches, and students may become disqualified for honor societies and honor cords at graduation or participation in school teams or events.

Third offense:

1. Zero for assignment.
2. Honor Code Notice to administrator.
3. Immediate out of school suspension until a parent meets with the administrator.
