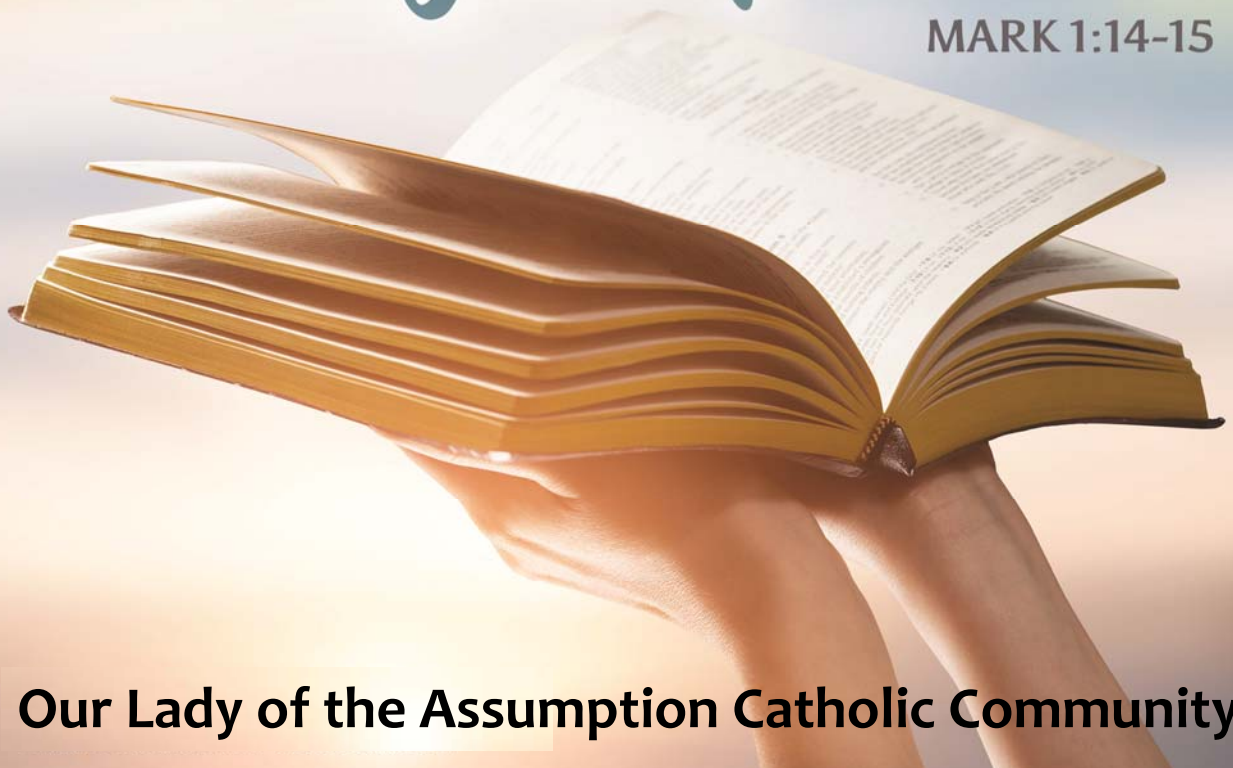

Our Catholic faith calls us to participate in the life of our communities. We are called to protect life from conception to natural death, and to promote dignity and respect for all human beings. In *Faithful Citizenship*, the U.S. Bishops write these challenging words: "In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue; participation in the political process is a moral obligation." In response, the bishops of California established the Catholic Legislative Network to help Catholics become better informed and act on important issues in our state. Through a brief, weekly e-newsletter called *Public Policy Insights*, members learn about issues and actions being taken on priority issues. In addition, periodic *Action Alerts* are sent to members asking them to send an e-mail, a letter, or to make a phone call to their Senator or Assembly member. Participation is entirely voluntary and it is always up to the network member whether to send an email to officials or not. There are several bills pending related to life issues right now. ## DACA-Taller de Renovación

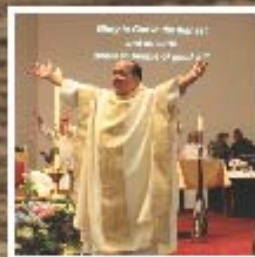
