Learning

Take the skills you are learning in your classes and apply them in a workplace experience.

Experience

Students who gain work experience during high school have higher employment rates and higher earnings later in life.

Networking

Build contacts with the employer partner you are working with: Recommendations, future job opportunity, mentoring.

Tackle new skills and enhance existing ones. Build a skills portfolio to add to a resume for future experiences.

STEPS FOR APPLYING

- **Step ONE:** Visit SanAntonioWorks.org and apply in the Student Summer Internships Section.
- **Step TWO:** Students will need to provide a resume and 2 references (non-family members): This person is usually an educator who has knowledge of their workplace skills and the other is a character reference, for example a coach, youth pastor, etc.
- **Step THREE:** Please ask a teacher or family member to assist you in creating a resume, if you don't already have one. If you do not have work experience, any class/club leadership is acceptable.
- **Step FOUR:** Upon submitting your application, please allow a few days for approval/response.
- **Step FIVE:** Please inform us about employer communications such as interviews and job offers that have been extended.

Frequently Asked Questions

Does it cost anything to register and be a part of SA Works?

No, it is a free program that connects you with local employers for workplace learning opportunities.

What are the requirements to apply for the Paid Summer Internship program?

- A. Be at least 16 years old or older
- B. Have at least one Career and Technical Education course that ties to the industry you are seeking a position
- C. Complete the application process on the SanAntonioWorks.org website in the Student Summer Internships section

What is the duration of the Summer Internship program?

Employers will decide the length. Most will be an 8 week experience.

Will I get PAID?

All of the SA Works Summer Internships are paid positions.
