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**School Information:**

The Alliance College Ready Public Schools founded William and Carol Ouchi High School, in 2005. As of September 2014, the school has changed its name to Alliance Ouchi-O'Donovan 6-12 Complex. The school operates on a traditional August-June academic calendar. The mission of Alliance College Ready Public Schools, a nonprofit charter management organization, is to open and operate a network of small high-performing 6-8 and 9-12 public schools in historically underachieving, low income, communities in California that will annually demonstrate student academic achievement growth and graduate students ready for success in college. Alliance Ouchi HS serves students in the area of Angeles Mesa and Crenshaw District of Los Angeles. The school, uses an educational model based on high expectations of students, small and personalized campuses, a longer school year and a longer instructional day, a team of highly qualified teachers and principals and parents as partners in their child's educational success.

**Grading:**

In alignment with University of California and California State University undergraduate admissions requirements, Alliance schools do not grant "D" letter grades. A grade below a "C" is considered "Not Proficient" and will not satisfy the Alliance graduation requirements. Students earning a "NP" for any required course must repeat the course to earn a grade of "C" or higher. Honors and Advance Placement courses are weighted with one extra point.

**Curriculum**

Alliance schools run on a semester calendars starting in August through June. Students engage in an academically challenging program that require all students to meet the University of California and California State University's "A-G" undergraduate admissions requirements. The curriculum is designed to prepare Alliance students for the challenges of college, as well as develop into successful and healthy adults.
