After much discussion we have put a lice policy in place that will meet the needs of Canton ISD.

LICE POLICY: A parent/guardian of a student attending Canton schools will be contacted to pick their child up in the case of active pediculosis (lice). If the student has nits without live lice, the parent/guardian will be contacted and the student may remain in school. Students sent home with active head lice may return to school after treatment. Information will be provided to parents/guardians at time of pick up that includes educational information about head lice and resources for the control of head lice. If other students in the same classroom are found to have head lice, parents of students in the classroom will be notified and advised to observe their children for symptoms of head lice.

Students should be encouraged to avoid sharing combs, brushes, and hair accessories. Mass storage of student backpacks, coats and hats during the school day should be avoided.

We also discussed our special education program that will provide schooling for our medically fragile students, opening Fall 2014. CISD has been preparing the facility, with health and safety being high priority. ERI consultants were hired and performed an asbestos abatement on the property that will house our special needs program.
