

DO YOU HAVE:

- 1. California Driver's License → Yes - Go to Notary ↘
- or
- 2. US Passport
- *Must be current, not expired



No, then DO YOU HAVE:

- 1. Valid passport or Consular ID issued by Country of citizenship - if not US
- 2. ID card from another State
- 3. Military ID
- 4. California State, County or City Employee ID
- 5. Tribal government ID
- * Any of the above must be issued within last 5 years, must have your photo and include a description of you, your signature and an identifying number

→ Yes - Go to Notary ↘



No, then BRING TWO WITNESSES

They must:

- 1. Know you personally, but can't be a relative and can't be involved in the Family Preparedness Plan
- 2. Have appropriate ID listed above



The name on the ID must match the name on the document to be notarized. The Notary cannot charge more than \$15 per signature notarized. A person who claims to be an immigration consultant or a specialist in immigration matters is prohibited from advertising that he or she is also a Notary.
