## Pre Kindergarten 3's

Backpack (large enough for folders, papers, etc)

1 large box of Kleenex

1 large box of gallon size baggies

1 large box of sandwich or quart size baggies

2 boxes of triangular shaped 8 or 10 count Crayola brand crayons

2 boxes of 16 count Crayola brand crayons (some brands don't write well)

3 plastic-type folders with pockets

6 glue sticks (purple works well)

1 pair of child's scissors with smaller and larger section

4 containers of Play-Doh (other brands often do not work well)

School box

Nap mat

Bag of extra clothes labeled with your child's name

Here are some activities you can work on with your child before they arrive to Pre Kindergarten 3:

- Identify colors
- Identify letters in their name
- Count to 10
- Work on writing name with capital letter at the beginning (or learning letters in their name)
- ABC song

3- 24 count boxes of crayons

Old t-shirt for painting

1 package of 20 pencils

6 large glue sticks

1 large Elmer's glue

3 large boxes of tissues

1 pencil box

Girls bring wet wipes

Girls bring 1-gallon bags

Boys bring disinfecting wipes

Boys bring zip lock sandwich bags

1 plastic nap mat, no cover

1 small blanket or towel and pillow (optional)

1 change of clothing - name on the bag

Here are some activities you can work on with your child before they arrive to Pre Kindergarten 4:

- Recognizing the alphabet (upper case and lower case), Recognizing numbers 1-10, Counting objects 1-10

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### Kindergarten

#### Backpack

- 1 pair Fiskar scissors
  - 4 large pink erasers
  - 3 boxes - 24 count crayons
  - 1 box of 10-12 count washable markers
  - 1 set of watercolors
  - 1 box of 12 count colored pencils
  - 1 bottle Elmer's glue
  - 24 small glue sticks OR 12 jumbo glue sticks (we use a LOT of glue)
  - 24 yellow #2 pencils
  - 1 school box
  - 1 blue plastic 2 pocket folder with middle brads
  - 8 dry erase markers (black)
  - 3 boxes of Kleenex
  - 1 box sandwich bags
  - 1 box gallon bags
  - 1 spiral notebook (wide ruled)
  - 3 containers of disinfectant wipes
  - 1 container of skin wipes
  - 1 set of extra clothes
  - Small blanket or nap mat for rest time (half school year)
- \*Please label all school supplies with an asterisk in black sharpie\*

Here are some activities you can work on with your child before they arrive to Kindergarten.

- Recognizing letter and letter sounds, counting to 100 by 1s, 5s, 10s, and rhyming

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1<sup>st</sup> grade

- 20 #2 Pencils
- 1 Hard Plastic Supply Box (5"x8"x2")
- 3 Boxes of Crayons (24 count)
- 6 Glue Sticks
- 1 Elmer's Liquid Glue
- 1 Set Water Colors
- 4 Folders with Brads and Pockets (1 purple, 1 blue, 1 red, 1 orange)
- 1 Box of Markers (basic 10 colors)
- 6 Big Pink Erasers
- 1 Round tip Scissors
- 2 Black Dry Erase Markers
- 1 Box of Kleenex
- 1 Package of Disinfectant wipes
- 1 Composition Notebook
- 1 Spiral Notebook (wide ruled)

Here are some activities you can work on with your child before they arrive to first grade:

- Practice recognizing and knowing the sounds of all 26 uppercase and lowercase letters
- Practice counting and recognizing numbers to 120, starting from any number and moving forward and backward
- Identify the four main coins; penny, nickel, dime, and quarter
- Identify and read at least 25 common sight words. Example: the, of, and, a, to, in, is, you, that, it, he, was, for, on, are, as, with, his, they, I, at, be, this, have, from

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### 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade

- 1 backpack
- 2 boxes of crayons (24 count or more)
- 1 box of colored pencils (12 count)
- 1 box of markers (basic 10 colors)
- 2 boxes of tissue
- 1 pair of scissors
- 2 packages of erasers
- 1 plastic pencil box
- 4 folders with brads (green, yellow, blue, red)
- 2 - 24 count boxes of pencils
- 25 Small Glue sticks or 18 Jumbo
- 3 composition notebooks
- 1 package of dry erase markers
- 1 watercolor set
- 1 disinfectant wipes container
- Girls: 1 box of Gallon Ziploc bags
- Boys: 1 box of Quart Ziploc bags

Here are some activities you can work on with your child before they arrive to 2nd grade.

- Practice reading at least one book a week or 15 minutes a day with your student
- Identify and read at least 50 common sight words. Example: the, of, and, a, to, in, is, you, that, it, he, was, for, on, are, as, with, his, they, I, at, be, this, have, from, or, one, had, by, words, but, not, what, all, were, we, when, your, can, said, there, use, an, each, which, she, do, how, their, if
- Practice counting and recognizing numbers to 120, starting from any number and moving forward and backward
- Practice adding numbers, objects, and addition facts up to 20

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3<sup>rd</sup> grade

- 4 - folders with pockets
- 5 - composition books
- 2 - 24 count boxes of #2 pencils
- 2 - large erasers
- 1 - package of erasers to go on top of pencils
- 12 - glue sticks
- 1 - pair of large scissors
- 3 - large boxes of tissue
- 1 - box of 12 count map pencils
- 2 - 24 count of Crayola Crayons
- 1 - package of 4 count dry erase markers
- 1 - pencil bag with zipper (NO BOXES)
- 2 - containers of clorox/lysol wipes
- 4 - highlighters (any color)
- 1 - package of wide rule notebook paper
- Girls 1 - box of Quart size ziploc bags
- Boys 1 - box of Gallon size ziploc bags

Here are some activities you can work on with your child before they arrive to 3rd grade.

- Practice reading at least 20 minutes a day and talk about what they have read when completed
- Practice adding and subtracting numbers and objects up to 100
- Practice counting coins and money and making change
- Practice telling time on an analog clock face
- Practice writing complete and neatly written sentences, including capitalization and punctuation.

Back pack

1-1 inch binder for Language Arts (reading, writing, and spelling)  
2 packages of 24 count Crayola crayons  
1 pair of large scissors  
12 glue sticks (these are used for all 4 core classes)  
2 large erasers  
1 package of erasers to go on top of pencils  
4 highlighters  
1 package of 4 count expo markers  
Ear buds or headphones  
2 containers of lysol/clorox wipes  
3 large boxes of kleenex  
Heavy duty pencil/supply bag (no boxes, please)  
1 package of wide ruled notebook paper  
Girls: 1 box of quart size ziploc baggies  
Boys: 1 box of gallon size ziploc baggies

Here are some activities you can work on with your child before they arrive to 4th grade.

- \*Practice reading at least 30 minutes a day
- \*Have your students keep a journal over the summer. Encourage them to practice writing creatively, with complete sentences, capitalization and punctuation rules.
- \*Practice adding and subtracting 3 digit problems.
- \*Practice counting money and making change.
- \*Practice telling time on analog clock face.
- \*Memorize and then practice multiplication facts every day, it is so important that they know these. We start off the year with double digit multiplication and very quickly move into division.
- \*Know your address, street, city, state and zip code.
