Why is your GPA important?

Your GPA is very important since it is one of the key factors in gaining admittance into college. It is also a determining factor in getting scholarships! The GPA you have at the end of your Junior year is the first grade point average the college or university will see when you are applying fall of your senior year.

To better understand the GPA calculation you can use this formula:

A = 4 points

B = 3 points

C = 2 points

D = 1 point

F = 0 points

Take the total points you earned and divide it by the number of classes you have taken. If you have taken 7 classes per semester you should get 14 classes per year. By the beginning of your junior year you could have at least 28 classes. Once you have added the points for the grade in each class, you would divide that number by the 28 classes to get your grade point average.

Graduation with Distinction

Attain a 3.0 GPA Plus one of the following:

- *Participate in at least one Governor's School
- *Participate in one of the state's All State musical organizations
- *Be selected as a National Merit Finalist or Semi Finalist
- *Attain a composite score of 31 or higher on the ACT
- *Attain a score of 3 or higher on at least two Advanced Placement Exams
- *Earn 12 or more semester hours of postsecondary credit that is added to your transcript

To be considered for Valedictorian, Honors, or Distinction, the above requirements must be completed by the end of 7th semester
