

Dr. Carol Rodgers is an associate professor of education at the University at Albany, SUNY. Her research focuses on reflective practice, the philosophy of John Dewey, presence in teaching, and the theory and practice of a humanizing pedagogy. In 2011 she was a Fulbright Scholar at Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University in Port Elizabeth, South Africa. She was also a Peace Corps Volunteer in Senegal in the late 1970s, worked for two years in Southeast Asian refugee camps in the early 1980s, and for nearly 20 years at the School for International Training in Brattleboro, VT. Her work is influenced by John Dewey, Caleb Gattegno, Maxine Greene, Paolo Freire, and her ongoing work with teachers and children.
