### HOME

- Ensure your child is on time and at school each day.
- Update contact information in the office.

### STUDENTS

Heritage students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in math and reading. Students will:

- Come to school on time and ready to learn
