Columbaria Rules and Regulations
Plants, Flowers, and Decorations

Guardian Angels Cemetery encourages the placement of flowers in memory of loved ones. Other forms of remembrance are limited for the safety of the Caretaker and guests and to maintain the solemnity and beauty of the grounds. Cemeteries can be beautiful and serene, or they can be cluttered and untidy. Only by your cooperation and adherence to these rules and by Guardian Angels strict enforcement can we attain our common goal for beauty and serenity.

1. The regulation of plants, flowers, and decorations shall be under the exclusive control of Guardian Angels Cemetery and Guardian Angels Church.
2. At no time may anything be attached or adhered to a niche front or hung from a vase or placed on top of the columbaria. These items will be removed and discarded by Cemetery Caretaker immediately.
3. As a safety precaution, flower containers made of glass, pottery, and other breakable material are prohibited and will be removed by Cemetery Caretaker.
4. Fresh cut flowers only will be permitted to be placed in the Cemetery owned permanent vases between March 15 and November 15 – flowers may not be laid on or near the columbaria site outside of the permanent vases. Fresh cut flowers will be removed weekly or at the discretion of Cemetery Caretaker.
5. American flags will be placed by the Cemetery Caretaker and at his discretion at or near the columbaria site as fits in the landscape.
6. The planting in the ground of any tree, shrub, bush, plant, flower, and any other vegetation of any kind, annual or perennial, is **expressly prohibited**.
7. Other decorations attached to trees or placed on or in the ground are prohibited. These include but are not limited to the following: ornaments, wind chimes, statues, birdfeeders, stepping stones, open flames containers, pennants and flags (other than American Flags for Veterans), pinwheels, Christmas trees, Easter eggs, Shepard's hooks, and lights.
