

Strike Chart Functionality: When a student exhibits behaviors that are not in alignment with rules, procedures, or expectations they are assigned strikes. Generally speaking, students are given verbal warnings from the teacher before they are actually given strikes. This system allows students multiple opportunities to correct their own behavior before they receive any actual consequences. The strike chart resets every two weeks and allows students a fresh start. The strike chart progression is depicted below.

1st strike=warning

2nd strike=warning

3rd strike=parent contact

4th strike=ISS lunch and parent contact

5th strike=1 day of ISS

6th strike=2 days of ISS

7th strike=3 days of ISS

8th strike=4 days of ISS

9th strike=5 days of ISS

10th strike=1 day of OSS

It is important to note that the strike chart does not reset until the conclusion of the two week cycle. That being said, if a student receives their 5th strike and is assigned one day of ISS and returns to the classroom the following day and receives their 6th strike then they will go back to ISS for two days.
