Fayette-Ware Girls Cross Country Captures Another Title



Fayette Ware girls' Soccer Makes History with 2nd Place District Finish

The Fayette-Ware Lady Wildcats soccer program made history last week as it finished second in the District 15-AA tournament, falling to Covington 7-2 in the championship. The Wildcats got off to a fast start against the Chargers when Jada Lurry scored in the 4th minute of the game. Covington was able to equalize 10 minutes later. Both teams battled hard in the first half and Covington eventually found its second goal late in the first half to lead 2-1 at halftime. Covington's depth proved too much in the 2nd half as they wore the Wildcats down and extended their lead. Jada Lurry was able to convert a penalty kick late in the game after a Covington defender handled the ball in the 18yard box for the final margin. Fayette-ware will travel to Kirby to face the Cougars in the Region 8-AA semifinals. This will be Fayette-Ware's first appearance in the regional tournament in school history.
