

NONDISCRIMINATION POLICY

In compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and the Americans with Disability Act of 1990, and the Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act of 1977, it is the policy of the Center Line Public School District that no person shall, on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin or ancestry, gender/sex, age, disability, height, weight, or marital status be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination during any program or activity or in employment. Section 504—Definition and explanation of process: Due process rights of handicapped students and their parents under Section 504 will be enforced. Under this policy, a handicapped student is one who: has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, including learning, had a record of such impairment is considered to have impairment. Students may be handicapped under Section 504 and this policy even though they do not require services pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).
