

**SHAC MEETING:** September 28, 2016

**TIME:** 12:00 PM

**LOCATION:** Smithville Elementary Conference Room

All attendees were asked to introduce themselves and the entity they represented.

**MINUTES:** Minutes reviewed and corrections were made. Sharlene Scheler made the motion to approve minutes with corrections made. Motion was seconded by Dr. Rock McNulty. Minutes with corrections approved.

**OLD BUSINESS:** The AIM FOR SUCCESS survey regarding the AIM FOR SUCCESS program held February 2, 2016 was distributed and reviewed by all attendees. Discussion followed. Dr. McNulty spoke regarding the value of the program and the statistical data presented by the survey warrants the continuation of the program. The AIM FOR SUCCESS program is scheduled for February 7, 2017 with a parent presentation on February 6, 2017. Sophie Weinheimer RN for the district encouraged all SHAC members to attend the parent presentation. Representative from Lone Star Circle of Care commended the district on hosting the program as a valuable resource for district students. Dr. Rock McNulty informed the committee that the school district was fortunate to have the support of the community to host this program. He informed the committee with students moving in and out of the district the program also reached some of the students in transition that were not receiving the information in other school districts.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Sophie Weinheimer recognized Tammi Hewitt, Elementary principal, for hosting the SHAC meetings on her campus. Recognition was also given to Michele Vire from food services for providing the meal of baked potatoes with all the trimmings and fresh salad as the meal for the meeting.

Sharlene Scheler introduced the new Methodist youth director. He discussed the plan for area churches to begin hosting 5<sup>th</sup> Quarter beginning October 7, 2016 from 10:30-12:30 at the Main Cafeteria and future dates at other locations. This first event will be targeted for high school age youth and will expand to include junior high students as well. He stated that the group is working on networking ideas to provide a joined impact on engaging the youth of the community.

Sophie Weinheimer recognized the Lion's Club for several of its members in becoming vision and hearing certified to assist with hearing and vision screening within the district.

Representative from Lone Star Circle of Care informed the committee of the resources available thru their clinic site. As of November 1, 2016 they will be able to offer assistance in helping

individuals with attaining the Marketplace health care as presented by the Obama Health Care Reform. Currently they have services in family, pediatric, women's, and behavioral health. They also service Optometry and Dental at their Georgetown site.

Representatives some Head Start spoke regarding the pregnancy program they have available thru their program and agreed to send more information to the high school nurse.

Janice Rogers, High School Nurse, opened discussion regarding the need for resources for flu vaccination for the insured students of the district. Currently the district serves the uninsured, underinsured, and Medicaid students with TVFC vaccine. Discussion was made regarding incorporating Walgreens or Healthy Schools programs to come into the district to immunize insured students. Dr. McNulty suggested to turn this to Sophie Weinheimer to establish this program.

The next SHAC meeting was set for December 7, 2016.

After no further discussion a motion by Debra Rose was made and seconded by Sharlene Scheler to adjourn.
