

LOCAL CONTROL FUNDING FORMULA (LCFF) replaces the previous existing K–12 education funding system of revenue limits and state categorical programs in California.

PCS receives about 85% of its income annually from Average Daily Attendance (ADA) monies from the state as laid out in the LCFF.

Enacted in Assembly Bill 97, as part of the Budget Act of 2013-14, LCFF creates base, supplemental, and concentration grants designed to provide:

Equity (equal *base grants* per pupil over four grade spans in every school throughout California),

Additional resources for students with greater needs (*subgroups*):

- a. Low-income students,
- b. English learners,
- c. Foster and homeless youths.

Local decision-making and stakeholder involvement,

Accountability,

Transparency and,

Alignment of budgeting with accountability plans (LCAP).

LCFF has an eight-year phase-in time-line, with *base grants* reaching their target per grade span below by 2020-21:

- Kindergarten - 3rd grade: \$6,845,
- 4th - 6th grade: \$6,947
- 7th - 8th grade: \$7,154
- 9th - 12th grade: \$8,289
