Bridget Brown Memorial Scholarship is given in memory of Bridget Brown to a young person dedicated to their friends and school. Academics must be a priority followed by a drive to excel in sports; a student interested in many areas of life. But, most of all, a caring and an outgoing student who loves life.
Dale Bardun Citizenship Award - This award is given to a senior who excels in personality, citizenship, initiative, self-discipline, cheerfulness, cooperation, giving of himself at any cost and an all around genuine person.
Dominic J. Carra Memorial Scholarship. The Dominic J. Carra Memorial Scholarship was established by his family and members of the Red Jacket Faculty, Staff and National Honor Society. Mr. Carra was a loving man who dedicated 31 years to the field of education, 21 of which he served as the Red Jacket Elementary Principal. James McNinch Memorial Scholarship is given in memory of Jim McNinch to a college bound student who has continuously demonstrated compassion for others.

Joshua Herendeen Memorial Scholarship is given in memory of Joshua Herendeen to a student who leads a well-balanced academic, athletic, and social life at Red Jacket. The recipient is a student planning to attend a four year university, majoring in math and business.

Mr. Harkenrider taught Mathematics and Physics in Manchester-Shortsville Schools for 19 years and became chief school administrator in 1953. He served in that capacity until his retirement in 1973. His leadership was instrumental in building the Jr./Sr. High School on its present location, bridging the two communities of Shortsville and Manchester.
Ray Nurse Memorial Scholarship was established by the Red Jacket Booster Club in memory of Ray Nurse, a long time coach and friend to many of the students at Red Jacket High School.
