California's comprehensive accountability system monitors the academic achievement of all public schools, including charter schools such as SDGVA, that serve students from K-12th grade. The Academic Performance Index (API) is an accountability rating score that alerts parents/guardians whether a school has met state levels of proficiency. An API score of 800 is considered proficient. We are proud at SDGVA to claim that since our doors opened in September of 2010 we have always been above proficiency levels.

San Diego Global Vision Academy is officially:

- 1st ranked designated *small school* in SDUSD.
- 2nd ranked elementary charter school in SDUSD.
- 3rd ranked overall charter school in SDUSD.

The API is used to rank schools in the state of California from 1 (lowest) to 10 (highest). Our school receives two different scores. One score compares our school to ALL other schools statewide. Another score compares our school to 100 other schools that have similar opportunities and challenges.
