

LCAP DEFINITION OF TERMS

LCFF – Local Control Funding Formula; California's new school finance model to allocate funding from the state to local school districts, county offices of education and charter schools.

LCAP – Local Control Accountability Plan; a plan adopted by a district, county office of education or charter school governing board, in concert with their budget, that reflects the goals and specific actions that will be pursued based on the 8 state priorities outlined in the LCFF legislation, as well as any locally adopted priorities.

PIQUE – Parent Institute of Quality Education; a parent education program that helps build partnerships between parents, students and educators to further students' academic success.

SBAC – Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortia; the Smarter Balanced online assessments will replace existing state tests in English and mathematics for grades 3-8 and 11 in the 2014-2015 school year.

SART - The School Attendance Review Team consists of a school site administrator, the District Attendance Liaison Assistant, teachers and/or counselors. School administrators refer students and parents to the S.A.R.T. process for attendance intervention.

SARB - The School Attendance Review Board is a community/school program designed to meet the needs of children and youth with attendance and behavior problems.

AVID - Advancement Via Individual Determination, is a college readiness system for middle and high school students that is designed to increase school-wide learning and performance.

STEM - Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics education is used to identify individual subjects, a stand-alone course, a sequence of courses, activities involving any of the four areas, a STEM-related course, or an interconnected or integrated program of study.

CTE - Career Technical Education programs are organized by 16 Career Clusters and 79 Career Pathways; CTE offers a complete range of career options for students, helping them discover their interests and the educational pathway that can lead to success in high school, college and their chosen career/profession.

ROP - Regional Occupational Program is a public education service that provides practical, hands-on career preparation and career guidance. The ROP is designed to provide students with the technical skills required for particular jobs. Community-based internships in local business and industry sites are offered in many classes.

EADMS - Educator's Assessment Data Management System is our district student assessment system, designed to work with any type of student enrollment, demographic, and testing data. It is a web-based application that provides two main capabilities to support K-12 schools: assessment creation and data analysis.
