

### **1210 - Board-Superintendent Relations**

It is the primary duty of the Board to establish policies and the primary duty, as the Superintendent of the school district, to implement and administer those policies.

The Superintendent is responsible for the development, supervision, and operation of the school program and facilities and will be given latitude to implement and administer policies in accordance with such standards as may have been set forth in the policies. The Superintendent will discharge his/her responsibility in part through the establishment and promulgation of administrative regulations.

As the chief advisor to the Board of Education the Superintendent should be consulted for background materials, alternatives, suggestions, and recommendations before any decisions are made by the Board. The Superintendent shall bring to the attention of the Board those issues that need deliberation and action. The Superintendent must keep the Board briefed on district operations and must keep the Board informed on a regular basis as he/she carries out the Board's decisions. Progress reports should be a regular item on meeting agendas. The Board should be provided with continuing information so they can tell whether the policies they have adopted and the actions they have taken are the right ones for the district or whether they need to make changes.
