.01 SCHOOL READINESS REPORT

Dr. Kaivan Yuen, Director of Student Program and Staff Development, and Project Assistant Jennifer Robinson presented a report to the Governing Board regarding the Early Learning Program designed to close the academic achievement gap and promote community well-being. Whitaker and Pendleton Schools hold three hour classes Monday through Thursday for 10-12 students between the ages of four and four years nine months. Beatty School provides an inclusion program for 8-10 typically developing students aged four and above on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday for two hours and forty-five minutes. Gilbert School offers two sessions of Think Together, once in the Fall and again in the Spring. Students between the ages of three and four years nine months are eligible to enroll with parent participation. Classes are held Monday/Wednesday and Tuesday/Thursday for three hours. Learning Link is a three-hour drop in

program held on Fridays for children ages 0-5 years accompanied with a parent.

On February 24, 2016, the State Allocation Board authorized an adjustment in the statutory school fee amounts for unified school districts pursuant to Government Code Section 65995(b)(3) to three and 48/100 dollars (\$3.48) per square foot for assessable space of new residential construction and fifty-six cents (\$0.56) per square foot of chargeable covered and enclosed space for the categories of new commercial/industrial construction and collectively.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 3547.5 public school employers are required to publicly disclose the provisions of all collective bargaining agreements prior to approval. The tentative agreement being presented for approval purposes the following: 1) a 3% salary increase for BPTA staff members effective July 1, 2015, 2) an increase in the extra hours, hourly rate by 15% from \$30 per hour to \$34.50 /hour effective upon ratification by both parties 3) related to this increase, the agreement calls for a one-time payment of \$50 per current unit members in recognition of extra hours worked during the school year prior to the effective date of the aforementioned hourly rate increase, 4) teachers who participate in a school approved overnight educational program, conducted during calendared instruction days shall receive a stipend of \$100 per day effective July 1, 2015, 5) the District will pay a \$500 annual stipend per elementary school site for assignments related to Student Council, Yearbook, and Math Teams, and 6) the District will pay a \$2,500 annual stipend for any teacher holding a current National Board Certification and a \$1,200 annual stipend for unit members that hold a doctoral degree from a nationally accredited university.

III. SUPPORT FOR ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIVISION

The Administrative Services Department, under the direction of the Assistant Superintendent of Administrative Services, requires support during the months of May through approximately December, 2016, during the anticipated leave period of the Administrative Secretary/Student Records Specialist. Qualified staff, proficient in Aeries and CalPads will be needed primarily to collect, data-enter, and certify reports for end-of-year (July) and Fall (October 10 December) CalPads reports, and to perform other administrative secretary duties as needed. The rate of pay for this classification is a range of \$30.87 - \$37.29 per hour (includes payroll benefits). Additional support is not expected to exceed up to ninety-two (92) hours total, payable from the general fund, for a total not to exceed \$3,432.
