

# National Elementary Honor Society

The National Elementary Honor Society (NEHS) was established in 2008 to recognize elementary students in both public and non-public elementary schools for their outstanding academic achievement and demonstrated personal responsibility, to provide meaningful service to the school and community, and to develop essential leadership skills in the students of elementary schools.

We meet twice a month and will likely be involved in the following activities this year:

- Clothing collection for local Magnolia shelter
- Contribution competition for Pediatric Cancer Month (September)
- Collection of and packing of care packages for Armed Service Members (November)
- Fill the Hat with Hope/Cancer Walk this spring

Students must qualify for NEHS by having a 95% or better grade average in all subjects for the two most recent semesters. We induct new members each spring based on their grades from the previous year. Our goals each year are to recognize the accomplishments of students -- the whole child, specifically the full range of a student's academic achievements and the ability to be a responsible student at school, at home, and in the community. We also focus on involving students as members participating in the activities of the chapter; and involving all students through leadership development and service activities, enhancing the 'culture of achievement' in the school.
