

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

This annual report card issued by the Oregon Department of Education offers a comprehensive picture of what Baker High School offers. For the 2015-16 school year, Baker High School once again did not receive an overall state rating due to the exception granted to the State of Oregon from the U.S. Department of Education, based upon the state's transition to the Smarter Balanced standardized testing system. However, although we are not receiving a comparative state rating, we are able to respond to the data points that have emerged for our school performance areas. As in years past, there are areas of our performance in academics and membership that give us reason for both concern and celebration.

Key academic findings:

- 80.6% at Levels 3 & 4 in overall ELA, which is 10.6% above the state performance.
- 30.7% at Levels 3 & 4 in overall Mathematics, which is merely 3.5% below the state performance.
- 75.8% met the OAKS Science benchmark, which is 15.8% above the Oregon average.

Overall, the assessment data reveals that we are performing well in comparison to the rest of the state. However, we continue to seek improvement in the area of mathematics. To address this concern, we have adopted a new curriculum and incorporated a staff development process to help our teachers implement the content with fidelity and consistency throughout the department. We will also begin using a new assessment program periodically throughout the year to diagnose student needs and track their growth.

We are especially proud of our overall achievement rates. When examining the data, one can see that our graduation rate (85.3%), freshmen on-track rate (86%), and completion rate (87.5%) continue to outpace the state average. In addition, our dropout rate improved from 4.7% to 1.8%, while the state average dropout rate is 4.3%. 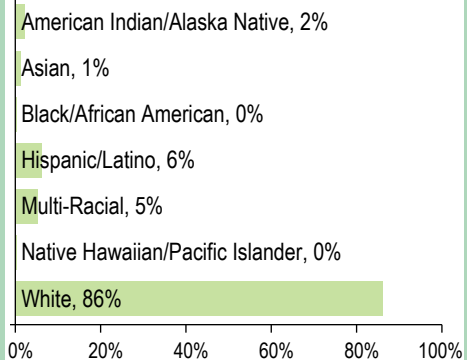

Percent of students without all required vaccines: 3

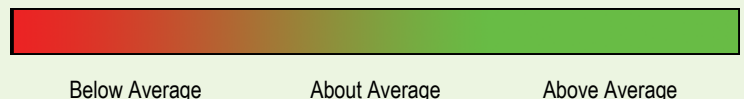
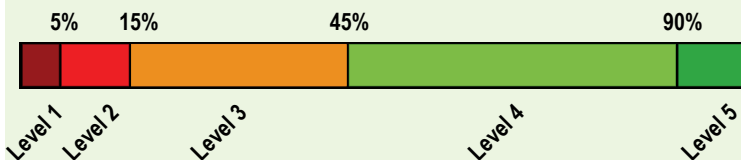
