The NET is an alternative high school program serving students aged 16–21 through a year-round curriculum. True to our name, the school is designed to meet students where they are; provide them with academic, career, and life training; and raise their own, their families', and society's expectations of their abilities and their future prospects. The mission of The NET Charter High School is to provide high school students with the skills, confidence, and experiences necessary to succeed in the education and career paths of their choice. We hold our own charter through Educators for Quality Alternatives.

WHAT YOU DO

Service learning students will volunteer to tutor NET students in math, science, and perhaps other subjects as needed. Students will work with our teachers and help reinforce classroom lessons. It is essential that service learning students interested in tutoring at The NET have patience and be willing to work in a non-traditional school environment.

For students who are enrolled in SPED programs, they will shadow and support our SPED Coordinator in everything from clerical work to direct service with students.

WHAT YOU LEARN

By serving at the NET, students will get to know educators who are dedicated to ensuring that all students receive an individualized education plan. Students will also learn how to differentiate material based on the learner's needs and get a chance to see project-based learning in action.
