Old Business:

- Walgreens and Sharlene Scheler, Wesley Nurse sponsored flu shots for the staff members of SISD. A total of 151 Flu shots were given. Sharlene said she would like to see more maintenance workers and bus drivers take advantage if the flu shots. She will speak with Zack Harris director of operations about this goal. - Wesley Nurse provided student underwear for all SISD school nurses offices.

New Business:

- Sophie Weinheimer informed the SHAC of the DSHS dental program which will provide oral exam and sealants to the SISD students. Motion was made by Judy Bergeron to file the dental program application and submit. Candy Biehle second the motion and all was in favor.
- Deborah Rose presented "Shoes that fit" program. All applications were submitted and a grant was given to the SISD students in the amount of \$5609. Deborah Rose has a SISD Google doc for student's names and shoe sizes. She and Crystal Reese will go to Rack Room Shoes and pick up shoes, shoe laces, socks, and back packs. She will distribute shoes to district campuses on Monday afternoon Dec. 12th, 2016. Also, a parent information letter will be included in the shoe box about the "shoes that fit" program.
- Anna Harris Lone Star circle of care informed the SHAC about the BISD "Coats for Kids" will be distributed on December 10th, 2016 at Mina Elementary. Anna Harris also requested a homeless count for our school district for the Bastrop Homeless Coalition. She was referred to David Edwards. She also informed the group that Lone Star Circle of Care is based on a sliding pay scale for counseling services, in addition to medical services. They also accept most major insurances, Medicaid, and Medicare.
- Candy Biehle informed the SHAC meeting that the High School started selling slushees and iced coffee as of today. Slushees are 100% fruit juices and iced coffee is made with skim milk meeting nutritional requirements. High School Special Education students are operating this service at the HS cafeteria to learn job skills.
