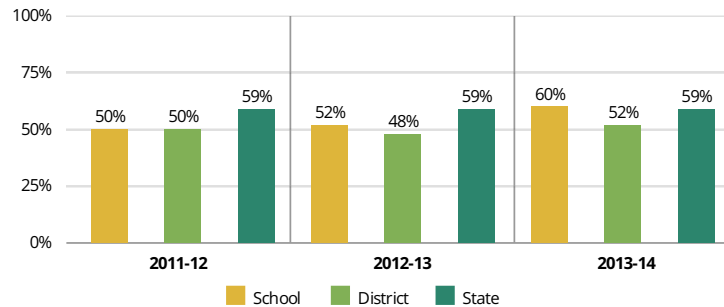
## Academic Growth

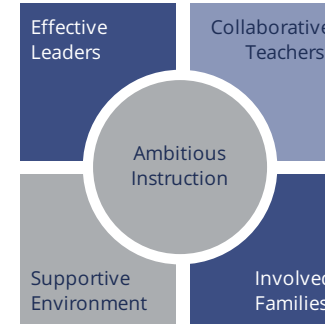

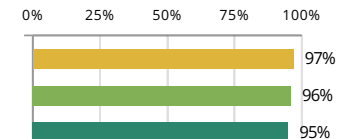

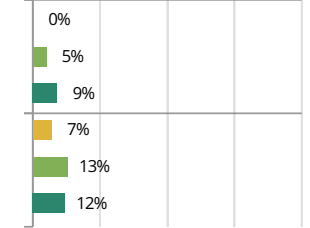
### Attendance Rate

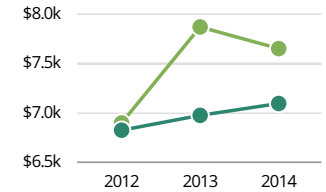

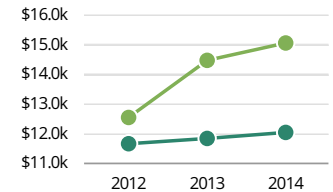
