## **STUDENT INFORMATION CONSENT PROCESS**

The District occasionally will use student images for educational purposes. This includes promotional opportunities with the media, advertising of the District, or participation in state or national competitions. These promotional items can be in the form of recordings, videotapes and slides, publications, news releases, training videotapes, District website, District managed social media and local cable educational channel. This includes school and extracurricular activities.

Parents of Allen Park Public Schools' students must notify the district in writing if they do not want their child's image (both still and video) or student produced work used in this fashion. All such images and video are property of Allen Park Public Schools.

If you wish to opt out, you must state your intentions in writing to your child's building principal.

## **STUDENT INTERNET ACCESS CONSENT PROCESS**

Parents must notify the District in writing if they do not want their child to access and use the internet for school work and research. If you wish to opt out, you must state your intentions in writing to your child's building principal.

APPS has installed filtering software in an effort to protect your child from viewing inappropriate sites and content. In addition, students are expected to use the internet only with permission of a supervising adult present in the classroom or other school locations. However, neither of these safeguards prevents misuse or accidents.
