## Tips for Creating a Safe Super Secret Password

- Spell a word backwards. (Example: Turn "New York" into "kroywen.")
- Randomly throw in some capital letters and punctuation marks.
- Choose some random words that don't normally go together (Example: correcthorsebatterystaple)
- Use an acronym from a phrase of your choice. "We didn't start the fire, it was always burning" becomes "wdstfiwab" based on the first letters of each word.
- Remember, the longer the password, the stronger it is. Always.
