

1215 - Board-Staff Relations

While the Superintendent, as chief advisor to the Board, has primary responsibility for providing the Board with information to ensure an informed decision making process, some things can best be learned by visiting schools.

A Board member may wish to tell the Superintendent that he/she is interested in visiting the school(s) and talking with the Principal(s) individually and ask him/her to make arrangements when it is convenient for the Board member and the Principal(s). Or the Board member can call the Principal(s) directly and set up an appointment.

All school visits are for the sole purpose of learning more about the district. The information a Board member gains is to provide background information for issues which may arise in the future.

A Board member should not visit schools with the idea of evaluating any person or program.
